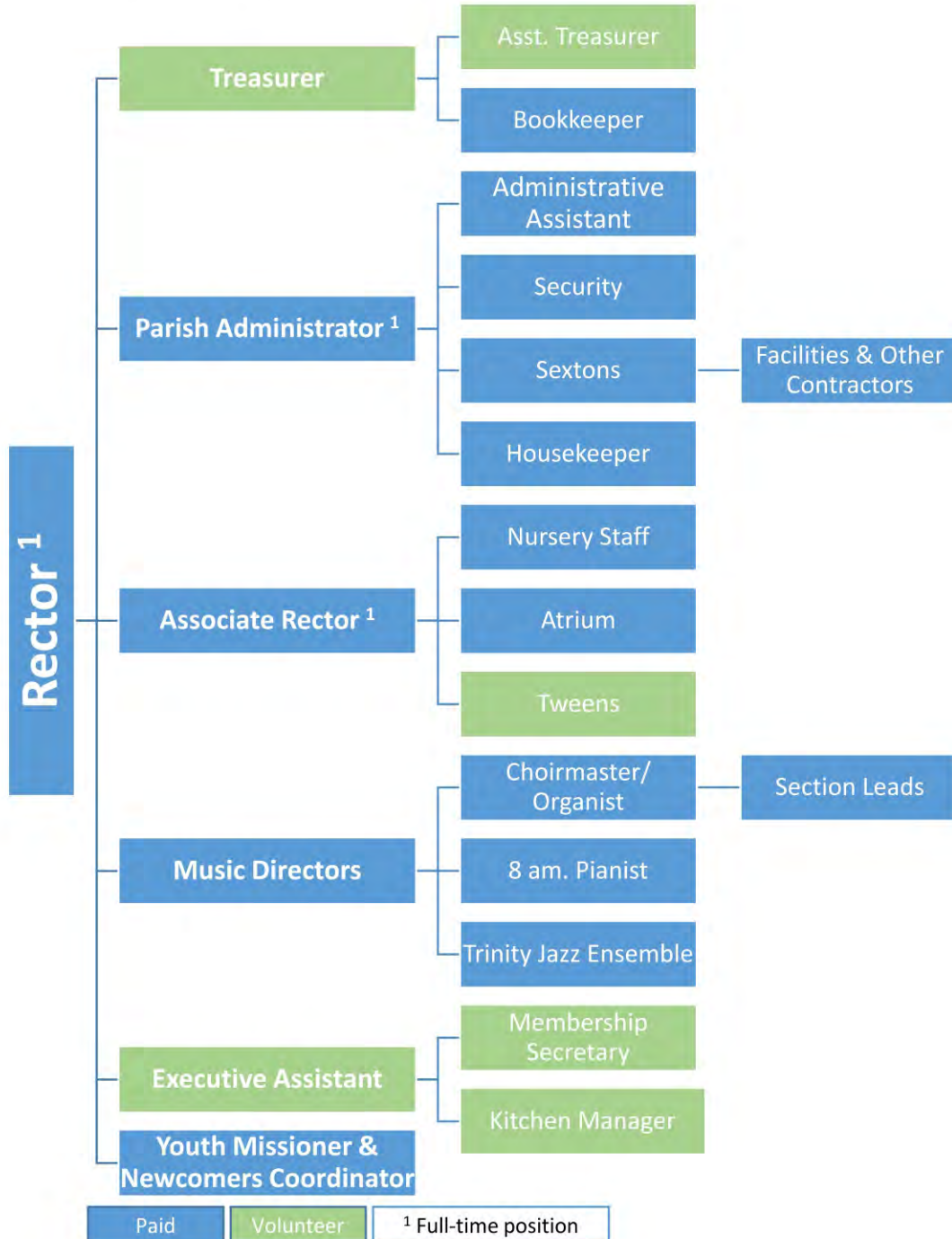

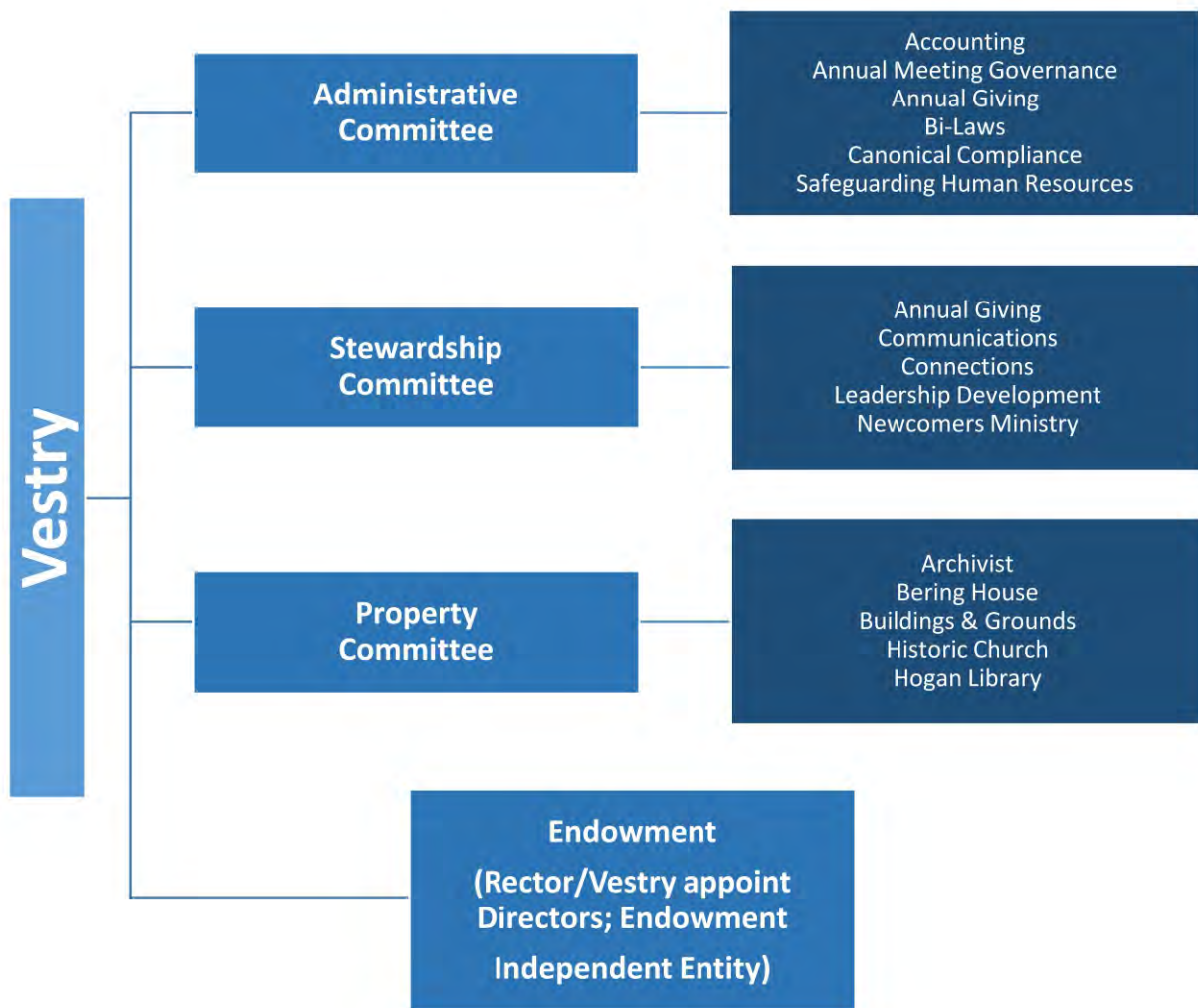
Organization Chart

Trinity Episcopal Church Staff Organization Chart with Office Manager



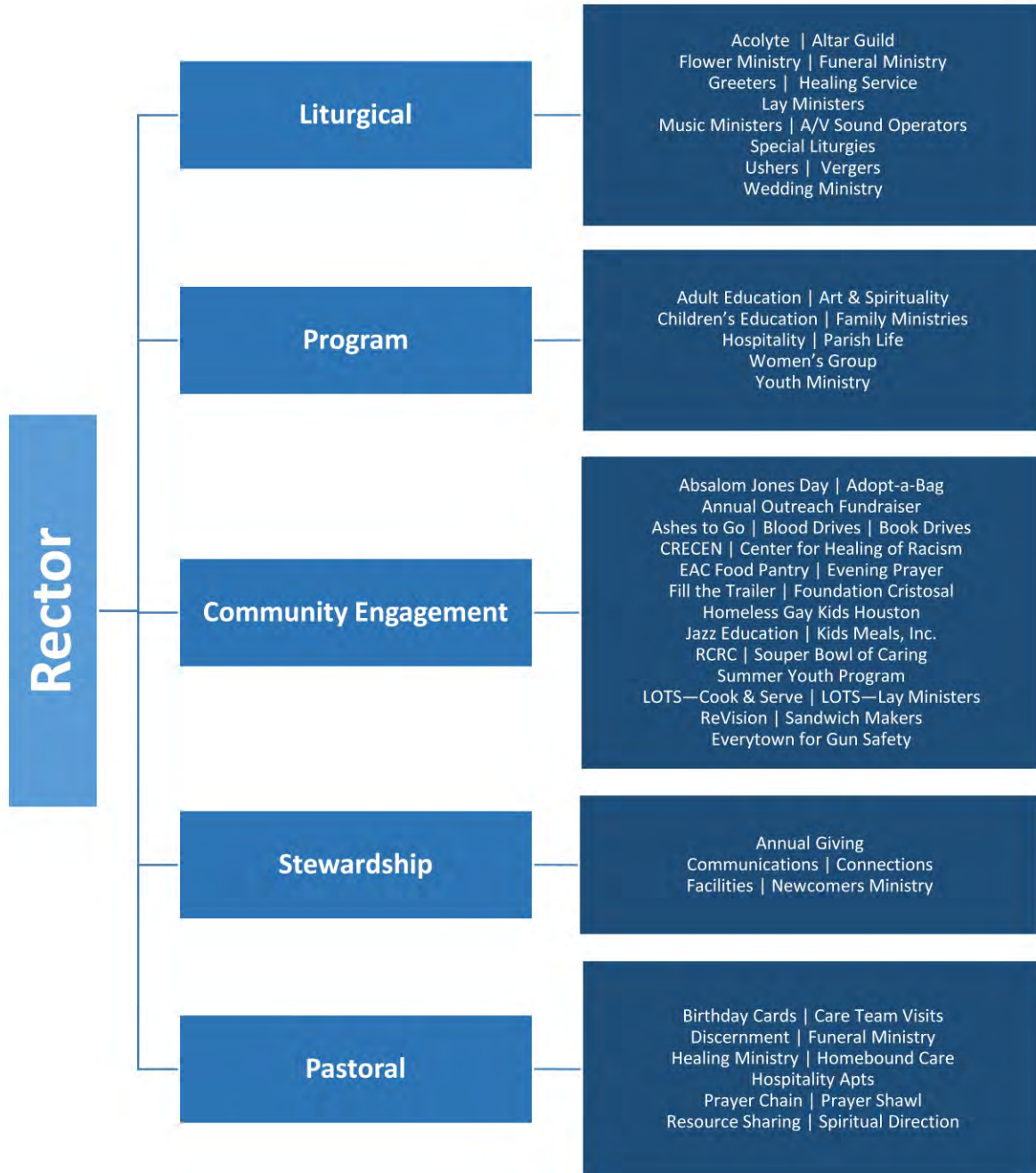
Organization Chart

MEET Our Clergy



The Reverend Hannah E. Atkins Romero *Rector*

The Rev. Hannah E. Atkins began her service as Trinity's fifteenth rector on Sunday, September 9, 2007. To prepare herself as a third generation Episcopal priest, the Reverend Atkins Romero earned a bachelor of arts degree in history at Douglass College, Rutgers University and a masters degree in divinity at the General Theological Seminary in New York in May 1996, with additional masters level studies in theology at Universidad Centroamericana Jesuita in El Salvador. The Reverend Atkins Romero has most recently served as Senior Assistant Rector at St. John's Church, Lafayette Square, Washington, D.C., as part of almost eight years of her parish service there. Before joining St. John's Church, she served as Director of Theological and Christian Education in the Diocese of the Episcopal/Anglican Church of El Salvador, Associate Priest at St. John the Evangelist San Salvador, Priest-in-Charge at Holy Trinity Church Santa Teresa in San Martin, San Salvador, and as Interim Priest-in-Charge at St. Andrew's Church in Amatepec, Soyapango, El Salvador. The Reverend Atkins Romero is married to Elmer Romero and they have two sons together and two daughters in El Salvador.



The Reverend Luz Cabrera Montes *Associate Rector*

The Rev. Luz Cabrera Montes started her curacy at Trinity Episcopal Church, July 1st, 2020. Before attending seminary, she was a bilingual education teacher and served as a lay minister and youth director at Iglesia Episcopal San Mateo. Luz has served this diocese and church in other capacities such as a deputy to the General Convention, a member of the Standing Commission on Structure, Governance, Constitution & Canons, and as Youth Ministry Liason for The Episcopal Church Office of Youth Ministries. Rev. Luz is married to Thanh Montes.

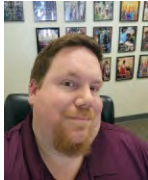
The Reverend Charles Graves IV

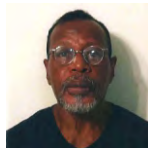

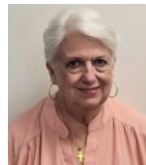

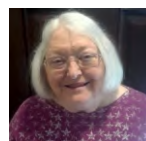

About the Book:

In this classic work, first published in 1994, Kelly Brown Douglas offers a compelling portrait of who Jesus is for the Black community. Beginning with the early testimonies of the enslaved, through the writings and thought of religious and literary figures, voices from the Civil Rights and Black Power era, including Martin Luther King, Jr., and Malcolm X, up through the contemporary work of Black and Womanist theologians, Douglas presents a living tradition that speaks powerfully to the message of our day: Black Lives Matter.

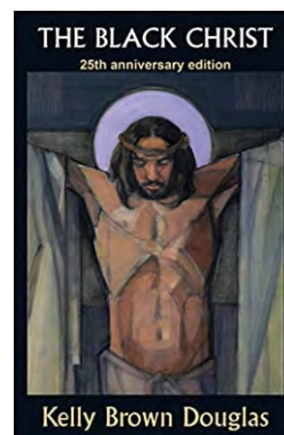
Exploring the theologies that formed this fear, we find that the God these theologies describe, and support is rather monstrous. Looking then at scripture, the realities we face in life, and Jesus' life of healing, we find that Christianity is not a religion of fear. Rather Christianity is a religion of healing, connection, belonging, and love.

We need healing. God knows this, and God loves us, so rather than threaten us with eternal torture, God becomes one of us, Jesus, sharing every aspect of humanity with us.

Kelly Delaine Brown Douglas is an African-American Episcopal priest, womanist theologian, and the inaugural Dean of the Episcopal Divinity School at Union Theological Seminary. She is also the Canon Theologian at the Washington National Cathedral.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a children's Sunday school group for ages 3 through third grade. It begins Aloha Sunday (Sunday after Labor Day) through Trinity Sunday (date varies by year) from 9:30-11:15 am. We offer the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd approach to spiritual formation. The class is led by a certified COGS teacher and additional volunteers as needed and meets in the Atrium. After the lesson, the children process into the church, receive a blessing, and return to their families. Drop-ins are welcome. Episcopal Children's Curriculum

Summer Programming: Children's Chapel meets the Sunday after Trinity Sunday through Sunday before Aloha Sunday. It is for children aged three through fifth grade and begins before the reading of the Gospel during the sequence hymn when the children process out behind the cross for a lesson and return to their parents after the passing of the Peace and before the Blessing of the Children.

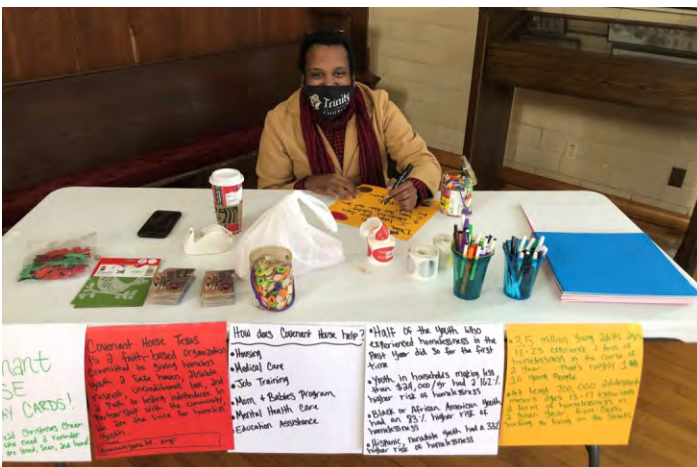

Trinity Choir

The Trinity Choir is an essential part of Parish Life at Trinity Episcopal Church. The Choir consists of mostly volunteer singers alongside a small group of professional staff singers. The Choir plays a hugely important role in the leading of worship during the 10:30am Sunday Service. The Choir typically sings for 11 months of the

year, with a 4 week break during the summer. We sing a wide variety of music throughout the year ranging from Renaissance polyphony, to newly commissioned works, spirituals and more. The music is carefully tailored to suit each Sunday of the Liturgical Year, and is offered to the Glory of God and as a ministry to the wider Parish community. The Music Ministry

Pelayo Parlade

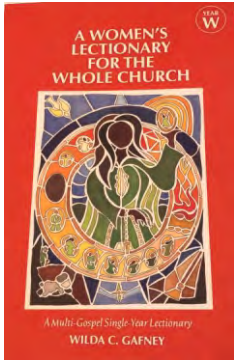
Co-Director of the Trinity Jazz Ensemble

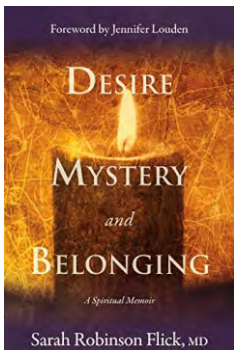

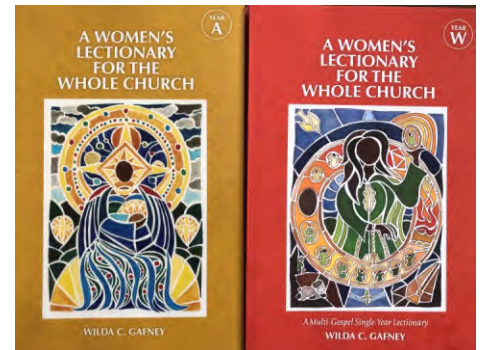

These requests for our Trinity family, as an example, could be for the sick, for deaths, families in need, or someone who needs prayers but does not want to give any explanation. There are no meetings to attend; just your time spent in quiet prayer. Book Drives for Harris County Psychiatric Center

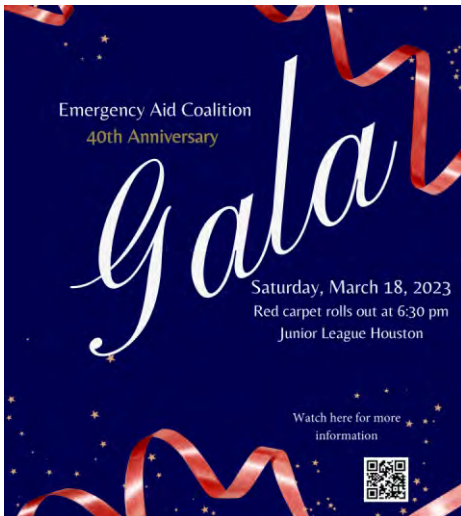

- physically accompany migrants as needed to medical, legal and pastoral resources;
- pray for the children and families; and
- prayerfully consider participation in ELCA advocacy.

Hogan Library

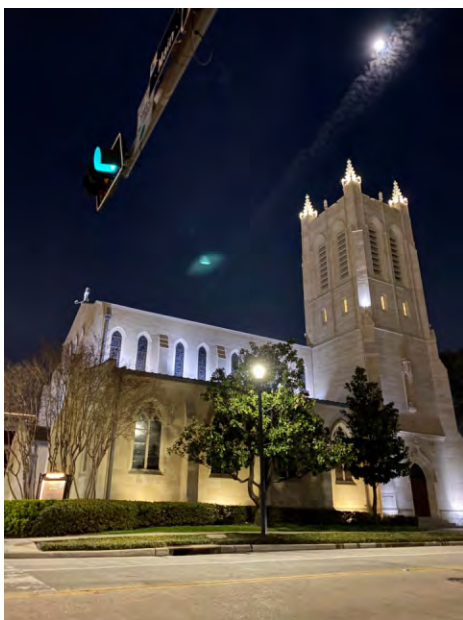

A History of Trinity Episcopal Church

Founded in 1893 as a mission of Christ Church, Houston's first Episcopal church, Trinity is located southwest of downtown. After a quarter of a century of existence in wooden buildings, Trinity parish built its present imposing structure (1917 - 1921) in Houston's South End, at the corner of Main Street and Holman Avenue. That structure, designed by Ralph Adams Cram of Boston and William Ward Watkin of Houston, became an architectural landmark constructed in the neo-Gothic style with Texas limestone and a 97 foot bell tower.

Altar Guild

This liturgical ministry is comprised of all who are called to serve God by preparing and tending the sacred spaces in which we worship. This team is responsible for setting up the Eucharist for all services as well as baptisms, confirmations, weddings, funerals, and memorial services. We also prepare the historic church and Morrow Chapel for all high holidays and maintain the collection of vestments and linens used in those services. Lay Minister

Lay ministers are trained volunteers who assist the clergy by serving as Lay Eucharistic Ministers (LEM), lectors, or reading the Prayers of the People. LEMs assist the priests during communion by administering the sacraments of Holy Communion, specifically the consecrated wine. Lectors read the assigned lessons for the day at a service. A reader leads the congregation in the Prayers of the People in a format from the Book of Common Prayer. All lay ministers are approved by the Rector, then trained and scheduled to serve. Vergers

The office of vergers has its roots in the earliest days of the Church's history. Generally speaking, vergers were responsible for the order and upkeep of the house of worship. Evidence indicates the existence of vergers as far back as the 16th century. Today, there are over 1,400 vergers serving all across the U.S., Canada, Great Britain and other parts of the world. The vergers is a unique lay ministry of the Church largely exercised behind the scenes providing support for all those, ordained and lay, who participate in our worship. Vergers carry out their ministry in a quiet and unobtrusive manner and assist the clergy in the conduct of public worship. At the 10:30 a.m. service each Sunday, the vergers functions as a master of ceremony working under the direction of the Rector and ensures all assisting liturgical ministers are present and ready to serve by coordinating with the acolytes, choir, ushers, Altar Guild and clergy. The Vergers motto is Service in Worship and Worship through Service.

From the Inside Out Project: Stations of the Cross 2023 Mothers and Families of the Disappeared, El Salvador Adam Kufeld, Photographer

Thirty years ago I made my first trip to El Salvador to photographically document what had become one of the most brutal US backed regimes in the hemisphere. At one point the US government was spending over 1 million dollars a day to prop up a government that was fighting it's own people. Those people were mostly very poor farmers, city workers and students. One common tactic the government employed was to show up in the middle of the night, and simply take away anyone suspect of supporting a growing popular resistance.

By the end of 12 years of civil war (1980-1992) over 75,000 people had been murdered and more than 10,000 had been “disappeared”, never to be heard from again. It is those people, their memory, and the families that have lost them, that we will try to bring to life with these photographs.

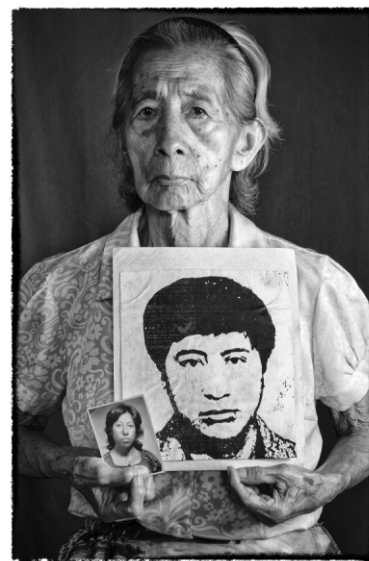
Currently there is a struggle for the ratification of international conventions of the United Nations and the Organization of American States for the protection of all persons against Forced Disappearances, and the recognizing of August 30th as National Day of Victims of Forced Disappearances.

We hope the photographs produced will be a small contribution to help guarantee that this violations of human rights not be forgotten, nor happen again.

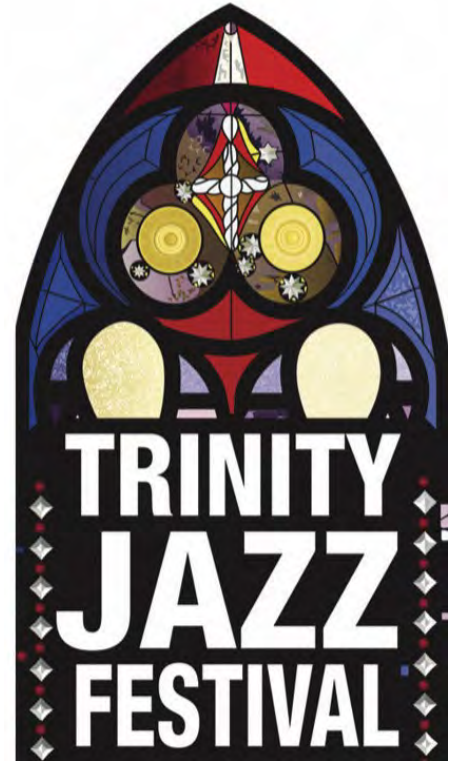
The photo exhibit is 200 portraits. They were taken in Santa Marta, Guarjilla, El Mozote, and San Salvador. It was part of Project Inside Out. The photos have been used in a number of street demonstrations/ mobilizations over the past few years.

Trinity Episcopal Church has selected 14 photos under the curatorship of the photographer, Elmer Romero to offer them as part of the liturgical season of Lent and Holy Week. These photos want to be a space for mediation and pastoral reflection to find in them the path that these women have lived in their Via Crucis of the disappearance of their sons and daughters and to find the resurrection of the crucified peoples.

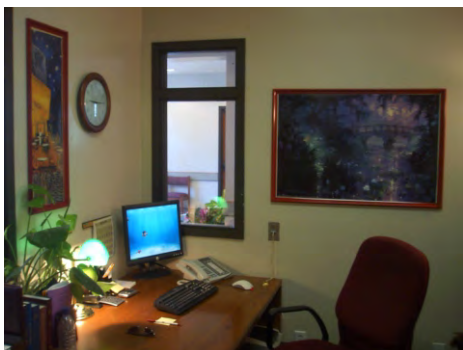


Taste of Trinity

The Trinity Peace Crane Ministry

Several years ago a group of Trinity parishioners began folding origami peace cranes, individually or in a group, as a spiritual practice. Over 1,000 cranes were completed, many of them containing prayers and Scripture.

In our new project, we are folding orange origami peace cranes as a memorial to children (ages 0–17) who have died in the US as a result of gun violence. Our goal is to fold a crane for every child lost in 2022. If we know the name and age of a child, it will be written on the crane. The cranes will be incorporated into the Gun Violence Memorial, adjacent to the Columbarium. Folding cranes will not stop gun violence, but the process is conducive to prayer and reflection, and when done in community the conversations we have and connections we make are healing. Archives

The Trinity Church Archives provides a safe place for the parish's historical documents and other artifacts. The archival collection includes service bulletins and newsletters dating to 1918, vestry minutes, registers of sacraments and services, parish meeting records, some financial documents, membership records, legal documents, architectural drawings, photographs, and much more. In 2014 the archives room was remodeled. To help protect the collection, a new HVAC system and dehumidifier were installed to keep the room at an ideal temperature (70°) and relative humidity (40%). Since then, many of the archival materials have been organized and placed in acid-free folders and boxes. Much more needs to be done. Endowment

Trinity Church Endowment was established in 1956 by six far-sighted parishioners who saw the need for Trinity to have a financial base. In the over 60 years of its existence, through good times and times of need, it has provided strong support to Trinity. In 2013, Trinity's Endowment provided a significant portion of Trinity's operating budget. In the last six years the Endowment has provided, among other things, \$250,000 towards Trinity's purchase of the Bering House property, provided \$100,000 of the cost of replacing the Fellowship Hall Kitchen, and approximately \$125,000 to refurbish the church's historic stained glass windows. In the Spring/Summer of 2016, the Endowment Fund has helped replace the outdated heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system in the historic church.

There are envelopes in the pews for Endowment gifts. They can be taken home for later use or with a gift placed in the alms basins. Gifts can also be mailed to the church office.
