THE BURIAL SERVICE

The Liturgy for the Dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we too shall be raised.

The Liturgy, therefore, is characterized by joy, in the certainty that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, principalities, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.







He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever.

For the duration of the current pandemic we will continue to offer communion in one kind for those who wish to receive the bread only. Please come forward to receive communion from a priest at the chancel steps. If you are partaking of the chalice, please use the hand sanitizer before approaching the clergy and chalice bearer. Also, if you wish to partake of the chalice, you may do so by intinction. Intinction is done by dipping a host into the wine, and is completely optional. If you prefer, it is perfectly fine to continue receiving the host only.



We offer a gluten-free bread option for those with dietary restrictions who wish to receive communion. To receive a gluten free wafer, please clasp your hands with palms facing each other when the priest administering the bread approaches you.

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Vinod Hopson

24 January 1975 ~ 28 February 2023 (48)

Vinod Hopson passed away on the evening of 28 February, after a brief illness, with his friends and family by his bedside.

Vinod was born 24 January 1975, on a very cold day in Hoboken, NJ, to Dawn (Miller) Hopson and Paul Hopson.

If you know and love Keith Jarrett's piano recording, "The Köln Concert", here's something special: the concert began in Germany approximately one hour after Vinod was born. We believe that the song is a celebration of his birth and life.

Vinod graduated from high school in Parsippany, NJ, in 1993. In 2005, he graduated-cum laude BFA (Photo/Digital Media), from University of Houston.

While at university, he became drawn to the work of FotoFest founders Frederick Baldwin and Wendy Watriss. He was hired at FotoFest, where he would spend the next 18 years overseeing communications and press.

From 2004 to 2007, Vinod also held positions at other Houston-area art organizations, including DiverseWorks and Aurora Picture Show. And most recently, he worked as the manager of Marketing and Creative Services at the School of Public Health at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston.

Beyond work, Vinod's passion for history and storytelling was funneled into his project, *Those Who Desire*. Using detailed maps, interviews, and extensive research, he gave tours investigating Houston's forgotten and frequently troubled history. Tours concentrated on Downtown Houston, the Historic Freedmen's Town, and the Camp Logan Uprising (1917). His current research centered on the Brazos River and the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Vinod was awarded The Idea Fund twice, in 2021 and 2016. He was frequently invited to participate in panels and various collaborative projects. He was a valuable resource to the arts and culture community in Houston.


While working at FotoFest, he met his soulmate, Jennifer Ward. They married in 2010, and in 2018 they were blessed with the birth of their daughter, Aarya Zuzu Hopson, a most beautiful child and their pride and joy.

Vinod is survived by his wife, Jennifer Ward, and their daughter Aarya Zuzu Hopson. Additionally, he leaves his parents, Paul and Dawn Hopson; a brother, Victor Hopson; a sister, Veena Hopson, with sons Revi, Ben, and Sean Paul; a cousin, Shaheed Sheikh, and his wife Glenda; and his uncle, Michael Hopson. In his wife's family, he is survived by his mother-in-law, Kathy Ward; grandmother Della Klesel; and brother-in-law, Justin Ward, his wife, Bonnie and their daughter Alaina.

His parents named their son Vinod to reflect his mother's Indian heritage. The name is used in India and Nepal, meaning "delight," "enjoyment," "pleasure," "happiness." Vinod was the personification of his name. Wherever he went, he carried joy with him to light up the lives of those he met. He had a passion for cooking, trivia, music and pampering chickens. He was a wonderful son, a loyal brother, a loving husband and father. To the countless hearts he touched, Vinod leaves a legacy of love, hope and courage. He will be sorely missed.
