PALM SUNDAY JESUS ENTERS JERUSALEM

The Sunday before Easter at which Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem is remembered by the waving of the palm branches. The service shifts and Jesus' Passion on the cross is recalled.

Celebration of eucharist and the washing of feet. Bread and wine is consecrated and reserved for Good Friday. The service ends with the altar being stripped and all decorative elements removed.

GOOD FRIDAY 11:30 AM CHILDREN'S PROGRAM (ATRIUM) 12:00 PM HISTORIC CHURCH 1:15 PM STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The commemoration of the crucifixion of Jesus. It is a day of fasting and special acts of discipline and self-denial. The passion narrative is chanted. Eucharist is not celebrated, but consumed from the reserved sacrament from Maundy Thursday. Stations of cross to follow.

EASTER VIGIL 7:30 PM HISTORIC CHURCH

The first celebration of Easter is also known as the Great Vigil. The service begins in darkness, and consists of four parts: The Service of Light; The Service of Lessons; Holy Baptism; and the Eucharist. This liturgy is an ancient practice of keeping the Easter Feast.
