

## THE FIRST LESSON

Genesis 18: 20-32

The Lord said to Abraham, "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know."

So the men turned from there, and went toward Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Then Abraham came near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" And the Lord said, "If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will forgive the whole place for their sake." Abraham answered, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?" And he said, "I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there." Again he spoke to him, "Suppose forty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of forty I will not do it." Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there." He answered, "I will not do it, if I find thirty there." He said, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it." Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there." He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it."

## THE SECOND LESSON

Colossians 2: 6-19

As you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead.

And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

Therefore do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths. These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God.

**Presider** The Holy Gospel according to Luke.  
**People** **Praise and glory to God.**

Luke 11: 1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name.  
Your kingdom come.  
Give us each day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our sins,  
for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.  
And do not bring us to the time of trial."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

"So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

## The Liturgy of Baptism

### GOD'S CALL

Presider Dear friends in Christ, God is love, God gives us life. We love because God first loves us. In baptism God declares that love; in Christ God calls us to respond.

### THE PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

Alice Vega Garrido  
Arthur Vega Garrido

*The candidates for baptism is presented by parents and godparents, who say:*

I present Alice/Arthur to be baptized and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

Presider From the beginning the Church has received believers by baptism. Believers' children have also been baptized so that with help and encouragement they should grow up in Christ and by the grace of God serve Christ all the days of their life.

On the day when the apostles first preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection, Peter urged his hearers:

"Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus the Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God may call."

Alice/Arthur, how do you respond to this promise?

*The parents and Godparents of the child may reply for the candidates:*

**Response      We hear God's call and ask for baptism.**

Presider Do you renounce all evil influences and powers that rebel against God?

**Response      I renounce all evil.**

Presider Do you trust in Christ's victory which brings forgiveness, freedom, and life?

**Response      In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life, as I care for this child.**

**People      May God keep you in the way you have chosen.**

### THE AFFIRMATION

Presider Praise to God who has given us life.

<b>People</b>	<b>Blessed be God for the gift of love.</b>
Presider	Praise to God who forgives our sins.
<b>People</b>	<b>Blessed be God who sets us free.</b>
Presider	Praise to God who kindles our faith.
<b>People</b>	<b>Blessed be God, our strength and our hope.</b>
	<i>The priest directs these remarks to all who are present:</i>
Presider	Let us, the baptized, affirm that we renounce evil and commit our lives to Christ.
<b>People</b>	<b>Blessed be God, JESUS IS LORD!</b>
	<i>The priest directs these questions to the parents and godparents:</i>
Presider	What is your faith?
<b>Response</b>	<b>I believe and trust in God the Father, maker and sustainer of all things; and in God the Son, my Savior Jesus Christ; and in God the Holy Spirit, giver of life and truth. This is my faith.</b>
Presider	How then will you care for these children?
<b>Response</b>	<b>I will love this child and share my faith with them.</b>
Presider	As the community of faith we rejoice at this baptism and will share with <b>these children</b> what we ourselves have received: a delight in prayer, a love for the word of God, a desire to follow the way of Christ, and food for the journey.
	<b>Alice and Arthur</b> , you will now be pilgrims with us. As members of Christ's body, the Church, you will be challenged to affirm your faith in God and receive the laying on of hands in confirmation. May you grow in the Holy Spirit, fulfill your ministry and follow Christ your whole life long. God bless you with wisdom and love; may these children find in you, your home and family, Christ's love and understanding.
<b>People</b>	<b>Amen. God of love, we thank you for our calling to be disciples of Christ. Help us to nurture <b>these children</b> in the faith we share. May they grow to love, worship and serve you, and bring life to the world. Amen.</b>

#### COMMITMENT TO CHRISTIAN SERVICE

	<i>The priest directs these questions to the congregation, who all stand:</i>
Presider	Those who are baptized are called to worship and serve God. From the beginning, believers have continued in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

- Will you commit yourself to this life?  
**People      I will, with God's help.**
- Presider      Will you forgive others as you are forgiven?  
**People      I will, with God's help.**
- Presider      Will you seek to love your neighbor as yourself, strive for peace and justice, and respect the dignity of every human being?  
**People      I will, with God's help.**
- Presider      Will you accept the cost of following Jesus Christ in your daily life and work?  
**People      I will, with God's help.**
- Presider      With the whole Church will you proclaim by word and action the Good News of God in Christ?  
**People      I will, with God's help.**
- THE CELEBRATION OF FAITH
- Presider      Let us rejoice with those who will commit themselves to Christ and celebrate the faith of our baptism.  
Do you believe in God the Father?  
**People      I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**
- Presider      Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?  
**People      I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.**
- Presider      Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?  
**People      I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**
- THE BAPTISM
- Presider      Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**People      whose promise endures for ever.**

Presider We thank you God for your love in all creation, especially for your gift of water to sustain, refresh, and cleanse all life.

We thank you for your covenant with your people Israel; through the Red Sea waters you led them in freedom in the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

Through the deep waters of death Jesus fulfilled his baptism. He died to set us free and was raised to be exalted Lord of all. It is Christ who baptizes with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

**People Amen. Come Holy Spirit.**

Presider We thank you that through the waters of baptism you cleanse us, renew us by your Spirit and raise us to new life.

In the new covenant we are made members of your Church and share in your eternal kingdom.

Through your Holy Spirit, fulfill once more your promises in this water of rebirth, set apart in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

*At the following words, the priest touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

**People Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honor, power and might be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!**

*The priest baptizes each candidate and says:*

Presider [Alice/Arthur](#), I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**People Amen. God receives you by baptism into the Church. Child of God, blessed in the Spirit, welcome to the family of Christ.**

*The priest makes the sign of the cross on each baptized, saying:*

Presider We sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ.

*A lighted candle is then given to each candidate:*

Presider [Alice/Arthur](#), walk in the faith of Christ crucified and risen. Shine with the light of Christ.

Presider God of grace, by the power of the Holy Spirit you have given us new life in the waters of baptism; strengthen us to live in righteousness and true holiness, that we may grow into the likeness of your Son, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Presider

If you wish to partake of the chalice, you may do so by intinction. Intinction is done by dipping a host into the wine, and is completely optional. If you prefer, it is perfectly fine to continue receiving the host only.



We offer a gluten-free bread option for those with dietary restrictions who wish to receive communion. To receive a gluten free wafer, please clasp your hands with palms facing each other when you come forward for communion.



## Lamentation - Remembrance - HOPE

We are folding **orange** origami peace cranes as a memorial to children (ages 0 - 17) who have died in the US as a result of gun violence. Our goal is to fold a crane for every child lost in 2022. Sadly, as of mid-July, that number stands at nearly 1,000 and will undoubtedly grow. (Over 20,000 people in the US have died as a result of gun violence in the first half of 2022.) If we know the name and age of a child, it will be written on the crane. As strings of cranes are completed they will be incorporated into the Gun Violence Memorial, adjacent to the Columbarium.

Folding cranes will not stop gun violence, but it is a spiritual practice that our ministry has found helpful, whether done individually or in a group. Folding is conducive to prayer and reflection, and when done in community the conversations we have and connections we make are healing. This project seeks to help us lament the tragedy of gun violence, remember victims, and create hope for the future.
